"GRAND OPENING" PARTY DRAWS HUNDREDS

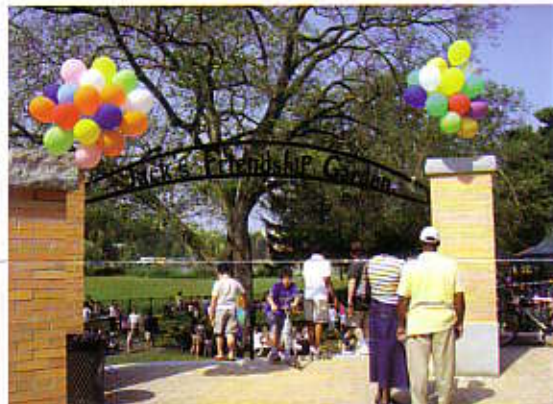
The opening of **Jack's Friendship Garden**, the handicapped-accessible playground at Huguenot Park, was celebrated with two days of parties on Friday, September 8th and Saturday, September 9th.

A ribbon cutting ceremony and reception on Friday drew hundreds of people, young and old, as well as local officials including Mayor Noam Bramson, County Clerk Tim Idoni, New York State Assemblyman George Latimer, County Legislators Judy Myers and Vito Pinto, City Manager Chuck Strome, Parks and Recreation Director Bill Zimmerman, Fire Chief Raymond "Doc" Kiernan, and City Council members Michael Boyle, Barry Fertel, Roberto Lopez, and Marianne Sussman.

Bob and Donna Young hosted the ribbon cutting event, providing refreshments that included cookies, bottled water and iced tea as well as free treats for all from the ice cream trucks parked at curbside. The Youngs are Co-Presidents of the Jack Robert Young Memorial Foundation, which they created to honor the memory of their infant son. The playground is the result of a collaboration between the JRYM Foundation, the Partnership for the Huguenot Children's Library and the City of New Rochelle.

The free drop-in program ran Monday through Friday from 10 am to 5 pm and offered supervised activities and access to games as well as arts and crafts for children accompanied by a parent or an adult caregiver.

The program coordinator for Old Fashioned Summer Fun is PHCL Board member Angela Taylor, and the on-site Director is Yan Mui. "The Old Fashioned Summer Fun" program gives children the chance to plant flowers, create arts and crafts projects, jump rope on the patio and play kick ball on the lawn as well as enjoy the treasures

FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK

Dear Friends,

Summer's over, and change is in the air. In July we bid farewell to Patricia Anderson, who retired as Library Director. The Trustees of the New Rochelle Public Library have selected a new Director, Thomas J. Geoffino, who started August 1st. Mr. Geoffino has 12 years of experience as a public library administrator and a proven track record in fundraising, long-range planning and the implementation of library programs and services. The PHCL welcomes Mr. Geoffino and looks forward to working with him.

But I want to take a moment to recognize and applaud the service of Patricia Anderson, who has served the New Rochelle Public Library for the last 20 years. Pat and her husband have moved to Florida to enjoy a well-earned retirement, but she has left her mark on New Rochelle. When Mrs. Anderson arrived in town, the main library had just two Apple computers – for staff use only – and a manual circulation system. Today the library boasts a fully computerized circulation and catalog system, computers on every floor and in every department, and services such as data base searches available from home, not to mention the existence of the only freestanding children's library in the state.

During Mrs. Anderson's tenure the Huguenot branch of the public library was closed in 1992 due to budget cuts (at that time the library was funded by the City); the Partnership for the Huguenot Children's Library was formed in response to that crisis, and Mrs. Anderson worked with the PHCL in its successful effort to renovate and reopen the building in 1997. She has been a tireless advocate for library services in this city, and leaves the NRPL system financially secure and in good hands with a dedicated staff and supporters who will make sure it continues to be a cultural center for the city.

On behalf of the PHCL I want to say

thank you, Patricia Anderson. The NRPL and the City of New Rochelle are better places because of your leadership and dedication.

Having said farewell to Pat, I want to take a moment to say my own farewell and to thank you all for your support of the HCL during the four years I have served as President.

We've had successes and we've had challenges in the last four years, but one thing has remained constant, and that is the support of the community. New Rochelle loves the Huguenot Children's Library, and supports the New Rochelle Public Library system. I like to think it's because New Rochelle recognizes how vital libraries are to healthy children and healthy communities.

I leave the Presidency confident that the PHCL's new President, Angela Taylor, and her Board will continue our mission: To inspire a life-long love of reading and learning through outstanding library services for all of the children of New Rochelle; to enhance the excellence of the Huguenot Children's Library, and to promote and advocate for exceptional children's library services within the New Rochelle Public Library system.

Bramson, and Lori Morrow, President of the PHCL, both Donna and Bob Young took turns at the podium thanking the community for its support. Noting that the playground was created to mark the brief life of their infant son, Bob Young called the ribbon-cutting a "perfect day and a perfect way to make a sad event in our lives into a perfect memory." Then the Youngs and their children, Connor and Lily, cut the ribbon strung across the park's entrance, accompanied by two bagpipers, Ryan Casey and Brian Johnson from the Iona College Pipe Band.

Saturday was clear and sunny, a perfect end-of-summer day, and the Jack Robert Young Memorial Foundation treated sev-

eral hundred neighbors to free food and entertainment for "Family Fun Day". Chef Brian MacMenamin (of MacMenamin's Grill & Chef Works) not only donated the hot dogs (600) and hamburgers (400), he was there in person behind the grill - along with Bob Young - serving up lunch. Chicken Joe's restaurant also donated 50 pounds of chicken nuggets and 30 pounds of french fries, and Longford's Own-Made Ice Cream sent over 400 cups of ice cream.

The playground project included extensive relandscaping and the addition of improved drainage as well as new equipment. The park now features one of only two handicapped accessible playgrounds in Westchester County.

ROSE BALL RAISES \$40,000

As the blizzard of '06 arrived, bringing record amounts of snow, more than 200 people packed the Fountainhead in New Rochelle for the Rose Ball, a benefit for the Partnership for the Huguenot Children's Library. Despite the heavy weather, the Valentine-themed evening – which featured cocktails, dinner, dancing to the music of the Michael Hart Band and a benefit auction – raised over \$40,000 for the Huguenot Children's Library.

Westchester County Clerk Tim Itoni was the evening's auctioneer; among the exciting Live Auction items were six tickets to see Billy Joel at Madison Square Garden, a week in a house on Martha's Vineyard, and a "pajama party" at the Huguenot Children's Library.

The tables were decorated with bouquets of red roses and scattered with rose petals; each guest received a handmade Valentine, specially created for the evening by Dawn Alfaro.
